From the 1957 address by then U.S. Senator Lyndon Baines Johnson before electric cooperative leaders, the idea for an annual Rural Electric Youth Tour was born. In 1964, the National Rural Electric Cooperative Association (NRECA) began to coordinate the program as "Youth Tour Week." Students on the tour learn about electric cooperatives, American history and U.S. government. They also have the opportunity to attend educational seminars, visit with their states' congressmen and tour beautiful sights in and around Washington, D.C.

Youth Tour offers students going into their senior year of high school the opportunity to go to Washington, D.C. for a week and experience all the beauty and history of the nation's capital. Youth Tour participants will have the opportunity to see the U.S. Capitol, meet with congressmen from their state, tour national monuments and memorials, and visit the National Zoo as well as the Smithsonian museums. 
